Partnership for Reading Success – Massachusetts (PRISM)

Considerations for Developing a Consortium of Small LEAs



Public school districts and charter schools with only one school serving students in PreK-3 must apply to PRISM I as a consortium with other LEAs, so that at least three schools serving grades PreK-3 are included in the application. **LEAs applying as a consortium will receive competitive priority in the PRISM I scoring process.** This one-pager provides suggestions and considerations for developing a consortium to apply to PRISM I.

Location Considerations

Since you will be working in close concert with one another, consider partnering with LEAs that are in close geographic proximity
Proximity will support regular visits, combined professional learning sessions, resource sharing, and collaborative leadership

Charter Network Considerations

Eligible charter schools that are part of a charter network should consider applying with other charter schools within their network
Charter schools without an existing network may consider partnering with the public school district(s) in their community



Existing Relationships Considerations

Some LEAs may have existing relationships – in the form of Networks, shared unions, etc. that would support the collaborative development of a PRISM I application

Other Considerations

• Consider local LEAs with the same curricular materials for core instruction and/or the same early literacy screening assessment

• Consider local LEAs with similar student demographics
